Happy Father's Day

"Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord." Ephesians 6:4

Today we pray for all our fathers and the weight of responsibility you bear. Our future depends upon you.

Speaking of families, Susan and I are blessed to begin our sixth year with you our family at Wesley Monumental UMC. God has blessed us with the opportunity to serve with you in this great church. Words: Sanford F. Bennett, 1868 Music: Joseph P. Webster, 1868

This hymn shares the same birthday as Wesley Monumental—1868. The hymn was composed when Mr. Webster walked into Mr. Bennett's business in Elkhorn, Wisconsin. Mr. Webster walked over to the stove and turned his back on Mr. Bennett without speaking. Mr. Bennett turned to him and said, "Webster, what is the matter now?" "It's no matter," he replied, "it will be all right by and by." The idea of the hymn came to Mr. Bennett in a flash, and he replied, "The Sweet By and By!" Mr. Bennett wrote the words at his desk as fast as he could write and gave them to Mr. Webster who then took up his violin and played a melody to it. He played it again, and Mr. Bennett sang it. A hymn was born.
