Long Story Short
Rev. Ben Martin and Rev. Nelle Bordeaux will be teaching from Joshua McNall's book <i>Long Story Short</i> in the Fellowship Hall. <i>Long Story Short</i> is a survey of the Bible that will introduce the Scriptures "not as a complex list of rules or doctrines, but as a single drama - a script - in six easy-to remember movements: creation, fall, Israel, Jesus, church, and new creation." It will help you see the Bible as one big picture instead of in fragmented pieces.
Every Good Endeavor
Rev. Jennifer Thompson will be offering an 8 week discussion-based study of Timothy Keller's book <i>Every Good Endeavor: Connecting Your Work to God's Work</i> in room 310 of Oliver Hall. This book addresses what God says about work; how you, as a Christfollower, should view work; and how you can better take your faith into the workplace. Whether you are paid for your job or not, this study will help you ask questions - and answer them - about what it means to be a person of faith at work.
