

We have also resumed Wednesday night programs. There will be youth Bible studies for all ages (6th-12th grades) for girls and guys.



"THE WORLD IS MY PARISH"

One of John Wesley's famous sayings, the symbol for which is found in our stained glass in the front of the church and on the center kneeler in front of the communion table, is "the world is my parish." Wesley, and the Methodist movement he inspired and organized, took seriously Jesus' call to "make disciples of all nations." We now live in a world that is "smaller" than ever. Electronic media and communication brings the whole world into our hands. It should remind us of our responsibility as followers of Jesus to look beyond our own doors, city, or even country for opportunities to live and share the good news of Jesus.

This month, several members of Wesley will be working on a mission team in children's homes in Tapachula, Mexico. Thank you for your financial and prayerful support of them. On October 13, the world will come to us in the form of the "Voices of Zambia" Choir. Some of you may remember them from a couple of years ago. They are a small group of men from the African nation of Zambia who travel, sing, and share their testimony to raise support for ministry at home. They will be singing in both services and speaking in the Fellowship Hall during Sunday school. October is also the month for "World Communion Sunday." When we gather at the table we are reminded that we are one church of Jesus Christ across the globe, united by what He did for us all on the cross. Many of you have also participated in our ministry to refugee families who have come to our community to find life with hope. While the world gets "smaller," we find ourselves tempted to shrink back into our own corners, but followers of Jesus will always be challenged by him to "be my witnesses...to the ends of the earth."

While "the world is our parish," our parish does begin here and move outward. Each year during the month of October, we turn our attention in the church to issues of stewardship. It is the time we begin preparing for the coming year. We are recruiting a new Leadership Team, planning a new church budget, and creating a new church calendar of ministry. Each of these requires the stewardship of talent, money, and time. Responsible stewardship requires prayerful and thoughtful planning and commitment. It asks us to prioritize our lives in order to make the best use of our scarce resources. Stewardship asks us to think about the future and Christian stewardship is not just next week or month or year, but to think eternally. For "the world to be our parish" we must begin with supporting the work of our church in making disciples of Jesus. It is hard to overestimate the impact of each person's gift of time, talent, and resources in making our church an instrument of grace in our lives, city, and world. Thank you for your willingness to give generously of yourselves in the name of Jesus.
