What can the most ancient stories of the Scriptures teach young people about contemporary life? A lot, as it turns out. At youth group, this winter we have been studying the story of the Old Testament from Genesis to Deuteronomy. For example, we looked at the accounts of the founding of the nation of Israel, God's people, through the actions of Abraham and Sarah, Isaac and Rebekah, and Jacob, Leah, and Rachel. While most origin stories or national myths would focus on their ancestors' greatness, the Bible presents us with some very flawed founders - an elderly couple who cannot bear children, a young boy nearly sacrificed, and a dishonest trickster and his unloved wife. The Bible does not so much present us with great people, but with people who serve a great God.



These stories also give us an opportunity to reflect on those who are unseen and unloved, whose voices are not heard in the narrative. What did Isaac think as he was led up Mount Moriah? How did Leah and Rachel feel about their marital arrangement? As we read these texts, we are reminded to look out for the unseen and unloved that we might encounter in our own lives. Through this kind of study, our students are being formed into careful readers of the Bible, and also people who seek to love God and love their neighbors in the world.

If you know a middle schooler or high schooler who might like to be a part of our youth group, our regular meetings are Sunday nights from 5-7 p.m., and Bible study on Wednesday nights following church supper.





favorite Sundays as I




promised to raise us in faith. What a blessing it is to be part of a family that knows and believes in Jesus.


🕋 all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. And these words which I command you today shall be in your heart. You

The Season of Lent


February is normally the month in which Ash Wednesday falls and the season of Lent begins. This year it is late in



ship! Bring your favorite games or cards. (We will eat brunch first so that those who want to stay and "hang out" at the Gardens can do so without time limits).




