The Joy of Sunday School

Our church is blessed to have a very dedicated group of ladies who come on Sunday mornings prepared to teach our youngest members lessons from the Bible. Our children love hearing the lessons and come running into the classrooms each week. Hear what the teachers have to say about the joy of Sunday School.

Lauren Cohn teaches a very active group of kindergarten and 1st graders and writes: Teaching Sunday School has been such a blessing in my life. Our children are genuinely hungry for God's word. What a joy to be a thread in their life story that weaves through their day and feeds

them His Truth. Teaching Sunday School also keeps the Scriptural Truth as the forefront story in my



own life. I thought I was going to be the one who would lead the children closer to Christ, when they're the ones whose faith has enriched mine!

Emily Davis teaches our babies and toddlers and writes: By far, my favorite thing to do is to teach Sunday School—not just for any group, but for our babies! Did you know that even the tiniest members of Wesley have a Sunday School class just for them in the nursery each week? We sing and play with toys as we're learning the days of creation and that God made us and He loves

us. We have flowers, clapping stars, a raincloud, animals, fish and birds to help get the lesson across. If you give your



toddler a Bible, they will find Jesus in there! To be fair, our Bibles all have a Jesus sticker to find, but how could I not be blessed when one of those precious babies shouts, "I found Jesus!" When Ben speaks about how all members of Wesley will influence a child who is being baptized, I am always pleased to know that the class I teach gets them started on their Christian journey. My heart fills when they run to their seats on Sunday morning when we ask, "Who's ready for Sunday School?" and I am blessed every time!
