THE SEASON OF LENT

This week is Ash Wednesday and with it we begin the season of Lent. For forty days we will be moving towards the cross and ultimately Easter. Lent is a season of self-examination and repentance, therefore it is a season of prayer and fasting. Lent is also often associated with the practice of "giving up" something. Most of us choose things that we like but may not necessarily need. Giving up something for Lent is a form of fasting. The spiritual disciplines of self-examination and repentance go hand in hand and in fact are intended to compliment or complete each other. What good is self-examination without repentance (confession and a commitment to change) based on what God shows me about myself and my sin? In the same way, what good is fasting (emptying or giving up) without refilling and giving. If I choose to fast from something that takes my time, how will I fill that time with something that draws me closer to God? If I choose to fast from something that cost me money, where can I give what I save to bless God?

Sometimes we choose to fast from things that are not good for us as a means to be healthier. Most of the time we are thinking about physical benefits, but what about fasting from things that harm me spiritually or emotionally. Above all Lent is a time to fast from sin, which often takes the form of attitudes as much as actions. What if I fast from criticism and complaint and with the emotional energy I save offer praise or thanksgiving to someone? What if I fast from bitterness or resentment and offer back forgiveness, patience, and understanding?

We may think, "It's only forty days," but forty days is long enough to form a habit. Forty days is long enough to change our lives. Remember Moses, Elijah, and Jesus were not the same men after their forty days on the mountain with God. It could be the same with us. Join us this Wednesday night as we take on ashes, the sign of our mortality and repentance.

Remember also that during Lent we are having a churchwide study on prayer using the book, Draw the Circle by Mark Batterson. Many of our Sunday School classes will use this forty day devotional book. If you are not in a Sunday School class but would like to use the book, they are available in the church office.


