### **Independence Day Worship**

This weekend as we gather in our sanctuary for in-person worship for the second Sunday after a three and a half month break due to the pandemic threat, we do so on an Independence Day weekend where our nation is wrestling with more than a virus. The difficult thing for me is that worship is intended to truly be a sanctuary, a safe place of retreat from the world around us where our attention is focused on God and we reorient our lives and perspective. But this year, we bring all that in here with us. Masks, social distancing, the absence of our choir and congregational singing are all stark reminders that we are still in a pandemic. And when we gather for the worship of God on a weekend in which we normally celebrate our freedom and nation, this year we are confronted with a nation in turmoil wrestling with difficult questions about what it means for us to be "one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

But worship is more important now than ever. When we come to worship, we are reminded of who God is, what He has done for us in Christ, and we bring faith, hope, and love to bear on the problems that confront us. Paul reminds us that "our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against rulers, against authorities, against cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in heavenly places." (Ephesians 6:12). While it is important that we bring science, technology, and government as weapons against disease and injustice, it is equally important that we as people of faith bring "the belt of truth, the breastplate of righteousness, the gospel of peace, the shield of faith, the word of God, and the power of prayer" to our struggle. As part of the people of God in America, we are called to bear a witness to what it means to be a light to the nation and a city on a hill where all people can come find the love and hope of God offered through us. So, welcome to worship. How blessed we are to be here together in the name of Jesus.
