BACK TO SCHOOL (SORT OF)

This week most of our children will return to school in some form (in-person, online, or some of both). Normally (though I'm starting to forget what normal was like) this is a big time of transition in our church from summer programming to school-year programming. Families are back in place after busy summers and our attendance begins to go back up. There is lots of excitement about new Sunday school classes and Bible studies, and Wesley Gardens summer evening services begin wrapping up. However, obviously these are not normal times. But, in spite of all that is going on, school is starting back, the summer is winding down, and people are moving back into school-year schedules, and today is Promotion Sunday as we relaunch our children's Sunday school program. We hope this will be a time for some of you to try in-person worship again. We are working hard to keep our services as risk-free as possible, and we are going to keep the 5:30 p.m. outdoor service at Wesley Gardens going for the next few months. We are also busy planning for our Wednesday night programming which will begin on September 16. We do plan on having children's choir, adult Bible studies, and a Wednesday night meal (though all of these will take a little different form to provide for social distancing and low-risk gathering). We hope you will make plans to participate at whatever level you are comfortable.

Just a reminder that we have not been taking an offering in any of our in-person services. While our giving has held up pretty well during the shut-down, and we are grateful for your generosity, I do want to remind you of several ways you can give: our online giving option at wesleymonumental.org, there are several offering containers by the doors in the sanctuary, or you can always mail in or drop off your offering at the office. As we move toward the fall and start thinking about the planning process for 2021, having a good idea about how our giving will look going into next year is really important in planning a responsible budget for our church. We hope you will remember the ministry of our church in your giving as you are able.

<u>Charli Weeks, Director of Children's Ministry</u> Where are the Children?

You may be wondering "why" in the time of COVID-19 our service does not include a children's sermon and the children are not in worship. One of the ways COVID-19 is spread is when people are close together in common spaces. Remember how it looked in our sanctuary, before COVID-19, when 50-60 children would come forward and sit by the altar rail for the children's sermon and then squeeze through the narrow doors at the front of the sanctuary when they were leaving. We identified it as a "Danger Zone" and developed a plan to eliminate that risk to the children.

Now our procedure is for the children to be brought to the Wayne Street door when they arrive. We will check their temperatures, ask a few screening questions, and then take them to their classroom. On the way to the classroom, we'll stop at the bathroom and wash our hands. Keeping our children and leaders healthy is very important to us.

• Under 3

We are never too young to know God's love for us! We begin teaching our youngest children when they are babies in arms. The babies are held on the laps of the nursery staff and join the toddlers for the lesson. They sing songs, hear stories, and look for Jesus in the pages of their little Bibles. It is a fun time for everyone.





3 Year Olds & Pre-K

In our Early Childhood Sunday School classes, we use a method of storytelling that engages a child's sense of sight, hearing, and touch as a way to encounter God, so God is experienced, not just learned about. Our time is patterned in a way that allows the children to come to recognize sacred time and space and be comfortable

using this time to worship and praise God.

• Kindergarten - 3rd Grade

This year we will continue our study of the lives of God's people in the Old Testament who lived close to God and are great examples of faith. We will use a multi-sensory approach to engage the children and allow them to see, feel, hear, and retell the stories of David, Solomon, Elijah, Daniel, and many others. Our goal is to extend and



deepen the children's understanding of the relationship between God and his people in Old Testament times.

Preteens & Youth (9:45 - 10:45 AM)

4th & 5th Grade (Room 305)

Spark: Activate Faith is a traditional style curriculum with time to read the Bible and reinforce its teachings through crafts, games, and activities.

6th-12th Grade (Room 405 or Zoom)

Our 6th-12th graders meet in Room 405 or via Zoom for fellowship and ageappropriate Bible studies.
