Mission on the Move

In 2001, I moved to Springfield, GA to serve the Springfield UMC. There I was introduced to a mission ministry called Mission on the Move. It is a mission ministry serving children in Tapachula, Mexico and Santa Elena, Honduras. The ministry began in 1986 under the leadership of Rev. Ed Cadle. When Ed retired as a United Methodist pastor, God gave him a vision of ministry to refugees which led him to Tapachula, Mexico on the Guatemalan border. What he found there was a profound need to minister to children whose parents were in prison. In that state, if there was no one to take the children, they went to prison with the parent. Since that time, the ministry began three children's homes there and later expanded to Honduras. Some dear friends of mine, Steve and Hope Shearouse took the mantle from Ed and after their retirement, Ernie and Alison Sizemore now lead the ministry.

Over the last several years, we have supported the work of Mission on the Move and several members of our church have traveled there to serve. Because of COVID, we will not take a team this year, but want to continue to financially support the ministry. The communion offering today is for Mission on the Move.
