Most years Advent is just an early Christmas, not its own season of waiting, expectation, and hope. But this year, we just may be in a place truly to experience Advent. For ten months now, we have been waiting. Waiting for life to return to "normal," for the pandemic to end, for fear and uncertainty to go away, for jobs to reappear, for schools to start back, for worship to return to normal. But we are still waiting. And so, what do we do while we wait? Give up? Get angry? Defiantly ignore the reality? Or keep waiting in faith? And faith in what? A political system? Science and technology? God? All of those? None of those? There is no such thing as faith without waiting.

And expectation? When this thing started I expected two or three or four weeks and it would be over for all practical purposes. And then weeks became months and months push towards a year and expectations eroded and sometimes hope with it. So how are we to maintain expectation? By following the press releases on rising or falling case numbers or phase three testing of a vaccine? Or by living in the present moment but trusting God holds the future? Faith is not faith without expectation.

And hope? A glimmer of hope. Is it in a potentially effective vaccine on the horizon? A change in political leadership? A recovering economy? Or is our hope in God? And if so, what kind of hope? Hope for the second coming of Jesus? Hope for some divine intervention? Or faith-based hope in the presence of God with us right where we are? Hope that is an "anchor for our souls" in the storm not just removing the storm.

I'm thinking this year we can really "feel" the season of Advent, so let's not just turn it into an early Christmas. Let's let this season of waiting, expectation, and hope settle in on us and shape and strengthen this thing in us we call faith. Then as the prophet said in another season when God's people were waiting in a time of trouble and difficulty, "Then your light will break forth like the dawn and your healing shall spring up quickly; your vindicator shall go before you, the glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer; you shall cry for help, and he will say, 'Here I am.'"
