CHRIST IS RISEN! CHRIST IS RISEN INDEED!

As the Apostle Paul wrote long ago, "If Christ is not risen, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those who have hoped in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died." (I Corinthians 15:17-20)

Welcome to Wesley Monumental on the Holiest day of the year. We are so glad you are in worship with us this morning. It may be after a year of pandemic isolation, we are more excited about worshiping on Easter than ever before. Hope compels us to be here.
