# Moving Towards Normal

The month of May is always filled with special days, all of which we were not able to celebrate together last year. Mother's Day, Infant Recognition, High School Graduation, Eli's Place Graduation, and Children's Music Awards are but a few special May events that come to mind. All of these are special to families and our church family as we walk through life together. This year as the number of people vaccinated increases and we hopefully see an ongoing decline in the number of cases, we are able to continue our process of moving back to more normal activities and worship at Wesley. This month we are going to reallocate the seating in the sanctuary where a portion will be every pew and other sections will offer every other pew more socially distant seating for those who prefer it. Our full choir resumes each week this month and we continue to increase our congregational singing in masks. The next goal will be to bring our children's sermon back to the order of worship.

Our staff has now taken advantage of the opportunity for vaccination, and we want to encourage our congregation to do also for our own benefit, but also for our neighbor and community. We have been very fortunate to have been able to continue most of our activities since last June. Many thanks to our congregation for your patience and cooperation, and to our staff that has worked so hard to make adjustments and keep our ministry going.

Mobile Mechanics

The inspiration for Grace Monkeys Mobile Mechanics was conceived during Rev. Martin's service on November 15, 2020. He said we should "...practice our faith by caring and compassion..." and "...to keep stopping for those who are wounded and broken by life." From this, I formed the idea of using my mechanical ability to support existing missions like Family Promise and Urban Hope by providing minor auto repairs to those



who depend on their vehicles to get to work or go to the doctor. I presented my plan to the Mission Committee and received their full support. Full credit goes to Nelle Bordeaux for the name "Grace Monkeys."

While my initial plan was to support current missions, the opportunity presented itself to help a local veteran in need. One of my neighbors shared a post on Facebook from another group called Team Savannah for Veterans (TS4V) who was looking for someone to repair the engine in a veteran's truck. I reached out to Chris O'Malley from TS4V and found out this veteran had fallen on hard times and had been living in his truck for a time. TS4V had been able to secure lodging for him temporarily but they needed help with the repairs to the truck. After consulting with the committee, I offered to make the repairs in my spare time but, in searching Facebook groups for parts, I found someone with a garage who was not only willing to repair the engine if Grace Monkeys paid for the parts, he arranged for the truck to be transported from Savannah to Warner Robins! It took a few weeks to complete the repairs but, on March 30, the veteran was able to drive his truck home.

While I didn't have to turn a wrench in this case, I was happy to be able to work with Team Savannah for Veterans and others to get this veteran back on the road, and I am looking forward to helping others as well.
