THE END OF SUMMER

Tonight will be the last Sunday of the summer for evening worship and dinner at Wesley Gardens Retreat Center. If you haven't had an opportunity to be a part of one of these relaxing evenings of worship and fellowship, we hope you will join us tonight. This also means we are moving toward the resumption of our mid-week Wednesday Nights at Wesley programming. On September 8, our Wednesday night programming will begin again. Though time flies by every week, it can be a long way spiritually from Sunday to Sunday. Setting aside time in the middle of the week to regroup, reorient our thinking, and be refilled spiritually is important. Our Wednesday evenings feature something for the whole family, including a wonderfully prepared and reasonably priced meal. The evening starts where it should, with prayer from 4:45 p.m.-5:15 p.m. Our 4th and 5th graders have Bible study from 5:00 p.m.-5:30 p.m. Dinner is from 5:30 p.m.-6:15 p.m. Children's choirs, youth small groups, and adult Bible studies are from 6:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. Then the chancel choir rehearses at 7:15 p.m.

This year during our fall semester, we will offer two adult Bible studies from which to choose. One will be a thematic study and the other a straight Bible study. Each study will last six weeks and then we will launch a second six-week series. The first two series will be a study of the book of Jonah, from the Series The Epic of Eden and will be taught by Jennifer Thompson. I will teach a study on the book Discernment: Reading the Signs of Daily Life by Henri Nouwen. It is a follow up companion to the book on Spiritual Formation we did in 2019. We hope you will sign up for a study, get your kids signed up for choir, make a standing reservation for dinner each week, and make Wednesday nights a vital part of your spiritual discipline this year.
