Autumn

While the autumnal equinox takes place near the end of September, in warm climates like ours, it is the month of October that turns my mind to fall. The first cooler mornings arrive and the days now become shorter than the nights. Leaves start turning loose and littering my yard. Football fans and hunters love this season, but I'll admit, autumn makes me a bit melancholy. Maybe it's because I'm in the "autumn" season of life, or just because I'm a warm weather "summer" person. This year many of us don't need any help from a seasonal change to feel this way. This lingering pandemic has not just been physically or financially challenging, maybe more than anything, it has been mentally and emotionally challenging. More than ever we need self-care, spiritually, emotionally, relationally, and physically. It is easy to lose our joy as we feel more isolated and alone than usual. It is a reminder we need our faith community who travel through life with us season to season.

Over the summer our children had a great time at Wesley Gardens during VBS and Summer Fun Days. New friendships began to form. Sometimes our new friends go to the same school and sometimes they go to different
