September marks our return to our school year programming schedule and the beginning of our mid-week dinner, Bible studies, children's choirs, and youth small groups. Our plan is to resume on September 8. After having to adjust our Wednesday night program last year due to COVID, we are really excited to return to this important part of our life together. The weekly habit of coming to church for fellowship and study in the middle of our week bridges the gap between Sundays and keeps us grounded in the middle of the hectic pace of our lives. If you've never been a part of the Wednesday night program, we encourage you to give it a try. There is something for all ages to help strengthen our faith.

Everyone is invited to begin with our prayer time from 4:45 p.m.-5:15 p.m. in the Oliver Hall Parlor. The 4th-5th grade Bible study meets from 5:00-5:30 p.m. Dinner begins each week at 5:30 p.m. At 6:00 p.m., children's choirs and youth small groups meet, and a nursery is available for our youngest children. Monica and Charli can help you get your children signed up for the program. This year, we will offer two adult Bible studies from which to choose. One will be a thematic study and the other a straight Bible study. Each study will last six weeks and then we will launch a second six-week series. From July 18-23, a group of Wesley Monumental students traveled to Birmingham, AL for a week of missions with Youthworks. We were divided into three teams and, each day, our teams were sent out to serve in charities, non-profits, and other sites throughout the community. Many of the students were privileged to work at the Lovelady Center or one of the Lovelady thrift stores. Lovelady is a program for women who

have been in the prison





system and are recovering from drug and alcohol addiction. Working alongside these women, our students were able to hear their stories and understand more about the least fortunate among us.

Our students also served in local food distribution centers - warehouses that process food donations and funnel the donations to local food

pantries. We were impressed with the generosity of so many individuals and businesses, but also distressed at how much

food is thrown away. One evening, we were able to visit the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute, a museum commemorating the history of the Civil Rights movement. We noted the rich history of this movement in Birmingham and other areas nearby, as well as the on-going need for justice and equality in our nation today.


September Luncheon
