## SILENT NIGHT

“Silent Night” is undoubtedly the most iconic carol for Christmas Eve, but I’m not sure how silent the night actually was for Mary and Joseph. I know another of our favorite carols says “but little Lord Jesus no crying he makes,” but somehow I doubt it. And apparently those shepherds were a noisy bunch too, telling everyone they saw what they had heard and praising God for all they had seen. And when is the last time you heard a quiet angelic choir? Mary and Joseph might have needed a little silence to try and catch a few minutes sleep in their exhaustion from a long journey, labor, and delivery, but for us, it is not a night to be silent. Tonight is the night to lift up our voices “with the angels let us sing, hallelujah to our King, Christ the Savior is born,” and to join the shepherds in their joyous praising and glorifying God for the good news of great joy they had received and the experience of meeting Christ Jesus.

For all the excitement and joyous “noise” however, most of us do long for and need some silent moments to “ponder” what all this means to us. In the hustle and bustle of the season, the rushing around to finish all the cooking, shopping, assembling, and wrapping, the getting to all the places we have to be, what may be lost to us is a moment to reflect on how this night changes our lives. Because of this night we believe in Emmanuel, “God is with us” and we are not alone; we believe we have seen the Father full of grace and truth; we believe our sins are forgiven because he came to be our Savior and gave His life for the salvation of the world; we believe God loves us more than we can imagine. Today we come to praise and celebrate in worship and song, but we also come to gather in a quiet moment at the table remembering what this night means to us all, peace on earth and goodwill to all people, Christ the Savior is born.

If we do find a moment to be silent and reflect, it would also be good for us to remember that for some people this season is too silent. There are those who miss the voices of loved ones lost, and others who find themselves alone. It may be that we know someone who needs to hear our voice and share our presence to break their silence.

Jesus, Lord, at thy birth, Jesus, Lord, at thy birth.




