#### A LONG WAY TO SUNDAY

We are a worshiping community. Sunday is the center of what we do. Which is why next week I am going to begin a series of sermons on the subject of worship. This entire fall we will focus on the what, why, when, where, who, and how of worship with our goal of making worship a more meaningful experience for God and for us. However, it is a long way from Sunday to Sunday and discipleship is lived out every day of our lives. Acts 2 describes the life of the early church in this way,

"42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. 43 Awe came upon everyone because many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. 44 All who believed were together and had all things in common; 45 they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. 46 Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home[k] and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, 47 praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved."

Day by day they studied, prayed, worship, fellowshipped, and served together. The key to their discipleship and the success of their church was spending time together. They encouraged each other in their faith and learned from each other. In other words, Sundays weren't enough for them, and it stands to reason the same would be true for us. Which is why we have Wednesday nights at Wesley. This Wednesday we will pause in the middle of our week and gather once again to pray, study, fellowship, worship, and serve together. It is a time for our children to grow in the faith through learning to sing the faith and worship, for our youth to learn together in small groups, for us to meet to pray for our church family, community, and world, to eat together, and for adults to study together. I hope you will consider being a part of Wednesday nights. It's a long way from Sunday to Sunday. See the insert in the bulletin for information about what is offered and how to get signed up.




