"Stewardship"

Stewardship is the responsible management or supervision of any resource. The Bible and the Christian faith talk a lot about stewardship. Human beings are giving stewardship over God's creation. We are called to exercise stewardship over our marriage, children, body, money, time, and talent. We have been given stewardship over God's church and the gospel message. At the heart of Christian stewardship is the idea that everything belongs to God, including our very lives. Jesus even teaches that how we exercise stewardship of "little things" here will determine what responsibilities and resources we are entrusted with eternally. While the Bible talks about a wide variety of stewardship responsibilities, it talks more about money than anything else. Jesus reminded us that it has the power to compete for our loyalty and trust, to function as a rival god.

Each year during the month of October, we turn our attention in the church to issues of stewardship. It is the time we begin preparing for the coming year. We are recruiting a new Leadership Team, planning a new church budget, and creating a new church calendar of ministry. This year we are also making plans for the renovation of our Education Building (you will hear more about it in the coming months). Each of these requires the stewardship of talent, money, and time. Responsible stewardship requires prayerful and thoughtful planning and commitment. It asks us to prioritize our lives in order to make the best use of our scarce resources. Stewardship asks us to think about the future, and Christian stewardship is not just next week or month or year, but to think eternally.

I hope you will join us this month as we address issues of stewardship and prayerfully think about what God has entrusted to each of us as a part of our responsibility for everything that belongs to Him.

Lending a Hand in Mayfield, Kentucky

On December 10, 2021 the National Weather Service issued a tornado emergency for Mayfield at 9:26 p.m. The tornado reached high-end EF4 intensity as it tore directly through the center of town, resulting in widespread, catastrophic damage. 600 homes were destroyed in Mayfield/ Graves County, Kentucky.

Through the hallmark connectionalism of the United Methodist Church, members at Mayfield FUMC reached out to family and friends at Wesley Monumental. Immediate financial assistance was sent. The connections grew from there. Having worked on other construction projects together in

Savannah, sister UMC churches came together with the help of the SGC Coastal District Mission Committee. In Mayfield, local UMC pastors, Revs Richard Dowdy and Mark Stephens had been managing disaster relief, mission teams, and reconstruction through their Graves County Cluster nonprofit that organized and funded reconstruction. Mayfield FUMC, Christ and Trinity UMC provided accommodations and great cooking throughout the week. The ladies of local churches put out a spread of country cooking every night.

Over the week of August 22-28, 2022, the team of 16 volunteers from 9 churches of the Coastal District fully insulated and sheet rocked the house. Corie Turley, Ann and Melvin Croft, Pat Monahan, and Scott Cleaveland represented Wesley. The construction was at the home of an elderly veteran whose house was obliterated as he sought refuge with his daughter in the hallway. They were selected for assistance due to being elderly and disabled, but also due to insurance failing to match the full cost of reconstruction. The Coastal District Missions Committee sent \$10,000 towards the cost of reconstruction, in addition to the \$15,000 Wesley Monumental sent immediately after the storm, thanks to your generosity.

Laying hands on the house, praying for the success and safety of the project, as well as healing and wholeness for the family and community were integral to the work week. What was best, the work was equal to the labor. We had the right skill set and the right number of workers. Pastor Richard gave

outstanding construction supervision. And at a time when so much of our denomination is focused on dividing, it was good to unite in service to others. The churches making up this mission team came from different perspectives - but when it came down to it - we were the same hands and heart of Christ in a tornado-ravaged community.

The team is already considering serving in eastern Kentucky in 2023 where the devastation of flooding has been just as substantial - and will no doubt take as long to assess and reconstruct. We already have those United Methodist connections at work in Hazard, Perry County, Kentucky. Consider joining us.
