GROUNDHOG DAY AGAIN

As I write this cover on the verge of another Groundhog Day, I was thinking about how it is a symbol of hope. Spring is coming, whether he sees his shadow and we have six more weeks of winter or he doesn't, and we have an early spring, we are hoping for spring. I personally am hoping for a cloudy day. I sure do like spring. What's the old saying, "hope springs eternal"? It means people can always find a reason to hope even in the bleakest situations. As Christians our hope is grounded in the resurrection of Jesus. It is not surprising we celebrate it in the spring.

Jurgen Moltmann is a well-known German theologian and teacher who wrote a book entitled "A Theology of Hope.".] Moltmann was drafted into the German army during WWII at only 16 years of age. He survived the war and in 1945 surrendered to the first British soldier he could find and became a prisoner of war. As he learned about the concentration camps and extermination of millions of Jews, Moltmann claimed his remorse was so great, he often felt he would have rather died along with many of his comrades than live to face what their nation had done. Moltmann met a group of Christians in the camp, and was given a small copy of the New Testament and Psalms by an American chaplain. He gradually felt more and more identification with and reliance on the Christian faith. Moltmann later claimed, "I didn't find Christ, he found me."

Moltmann says faith and hope are inseparable companions. "Hope is nothing else than the expectation of those things which faith has believed to have been truly promised by God. This faith believes God to be true, hope awaits a time when this truth shall be manifested; faith believes that He is our Father, hope anticipates that He will ever show Himself to be a Father toward us; faith believes that eternal life has been given to us; hope anticipates that it will some time be revealed; faith is the foundation on which hope rests, hope nourishes and sustains faith."

Sunday worship is about faith and hope, but our faith and hope are grounded in the love of God in Christ. This morning as we gather once again at the table, we do so believing with the Apostle Paul, when all other things fail and pass away, faith, hope, and love will remain. It is my prayer your faith is strengthened, your hope enlivened, and your love deepened as we worship today.
