A Month of Worship & Celebration

No month of the Church year has more special occasions than April!

April 2 with Palm Sunday, the kickoff for Holy Week. We will also have a Church Conference that morning during the Sunday School hour (9:45 a.m.) to vote on moving ahead with a renovation of the old Education Building, music, and children's areas (floors 2, 3, 4). The Children's Easter Egg Hunt will take place at Wesley Gardens that afternoon at 4:00 p.m.

April 3-7 we will worship all week long during Holy Week with lunch services Monday-Wednesday, Maundy Thursday evening dinner and communion, and Good Friday service at noon.

April 9 we will join in Easter celebrations at 7:00 a.m. at Wesley Gardens, 8:45 and 11:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary.

April 16 we will launch a new Sunday school class for adults 25-40 years old. "The Millennial Blend," a Sunday school class for all millennial adults (single, married, with kids, without kids - all millennials are welcome) will be led by Aaron and Ashley Higgins in the Oliver Hall Parlor. They will be studying the book *What if Jesus was Serious About Prayer?* By Skye Jethani.

On April 23 during Sunday School, we will welcome Rev. David Worthington, Director of Global Relationships at John Wesley's New Room in Bristol, the oldest Methodist building in the world. *"Dating from 1739; the year when John Wesley first arrived in the city of Bristol to begin his open-air preaching ministry as he 'submitted to be more vile and proclaimed in the highways the glad tidings of salvation'. It was built as a meeting house for ministry where both spiritual instruction and practical support could be offered to those in need and many preachers were commissioned in their ministries, including Francis Asbury and Thomas Coke as they began their respective journeys to America from the New Room."* Today, the New Room's offer includes a museum, library for academic research, education provision, events program, and café as well as the original

18th century chapel where a communion service is held every Friday. The site, which is open throughout the year, presently welcomes over 50,000 visitors per annum from all over the world.

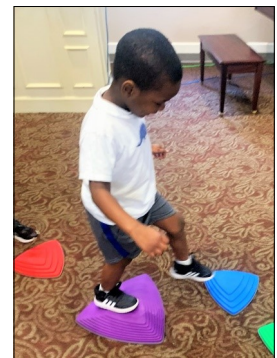
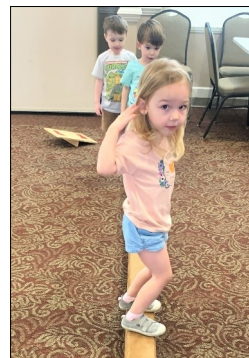


Summer Camp at Eli's Place

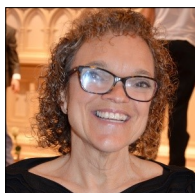

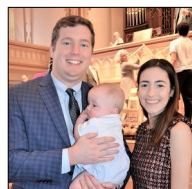
