It is common in most areas of our lives that when we fail at something we have a need for the opportunity to try again. When we were kids playing, how often when we messed up did we say, "that doesn't count" or "I was just practicing" or "do over." In golf we take mulligans, teachers sometimes give "make-up" work, and we put erasers on pencils. And then, there is this thing called forgiveness. To be forgiven is to be given a chance to start over in spite of past failure. It never means what happened to necessitate forgiveness didn't matter, it means someone is giving me another chance in spite of it.

The beginning of a new year is a time when we wipe the slate clean and start over in many areas. Before all our electronic devices, we actually started a new calendar and it was a clean slate. It is a new tax year, a new fiscal year, a new vacation year (yea!), and a new deductible year (yuk!) How often do we feel the need to start over with God? There is something about the pursuit of "holiness" or "being perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect," that makes us feel like we often miss the mark. The good news is that the Bible teaches us repeatedly that God is a God of new beginnings. The Prophet says God offers a "new covenant" where he will "remember our sins no more." Paul speaks of "forgetting what is behind and straining towards what is ahead." And in Revelation, God says, "behold I am making all things new." There is a prayer I love that is part of the United Methodist Morning Prayer liturgy. It reminds us that every day is a new beginning. It would be a good prayer to use during this new year.

New every morning is your love, Great God of light, and all day long you are working for good in the world.

Stir up in us desire to serve you, to live peacefully with our neighbors, and to devote each day to your Son, our Savior, Jesus Christ the Lord. Amen.
