Happy Father's Day

"Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord." Ephesians 6:4

Today is Father's Day and in a church like ours, blessed with so many children and young families, it is in large part a day of celebration. For others of us, it is a day of remembrance and gratitude for the gift of a father now gone whose love and example helped make us who we are. We must acknowledge however, for some it is a painful day that confronts us with the frailty and faults of a father who did not fulfill the role God intended. The day also reminds us that being a father is a gift and a responsibility. Paul speaks to it in his letter to the Ephesians and the importance of the teaching role of a father. It is also interesting that this verse follows on the heels of some instruction to husbands about how to love and serve our wives. Maybe nothing fathers do is more important than modeling what a husband should be for our children. Today we pray and give thanks for all our fathers, and for our Father in Heaven whose love is unfailing.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve you and for the incredible generosity and encouragement you show us.
