They recognized discipleship was a group effort and a daily activity. If you've never been a part of the Wednesday night program, we encourage you to give it a try. Owens will be teaching a Bible study in the Fellowship Hall on the book of James. I'll be teaching a book study on a book by Richard Rohr entitled, *The Universal Christ*. Confirmation Class begins September 10!

This year's Confirmation Class will hold its first meeting on September 10 during the Sunday school hour. Confirmation is a time when our young people learn more about the Christian faith and our United Methodist heritage, and they have the opportunity to make a profession of faith and become full members of the church. Any students in 6th grade or older who have not previously been confirmed are welcome! Our other fall meetings will be on October 15, November 12, and December 3, and make-up classes will be offered as needed.





Sunday School

This year we are hiking the Jesus Trail from Nazareth to the Sea of Galilee and hearing the lessons Jesus taught to the crowds of people who came to hear Him. Today the children are making a 3D map of that part of Israel. Every Sunday, there are fun activities for children during Children's Worship and Sunday School. Games, skits, art projects, and more are used to engage the children in Bible lessons. Sunday school classrooms open at 9:45 a.m., and the teachers begin the lesson at 10:00 a.m.





Children attending the early service can be picked up from their classroom at 10:45 a.m. Children staying for the 11:00 service enjoy going to the Sanctuary together for the beginning of the service. After the Children's Sermon, the children go to Children's Worship and can be picked up from the Fellowship Hall at the end of the service.

Sunday School teachers are still needed for our preschool and elementary classes. Lessons and art activities are prepared by staff each week, and adults serve 2-3 times a month. Call or email Charli if you feel God is calling you to this important work.






Wesley Christmas Bazaar




Fourth Friday Retreat




