Back to School, a New Sermon Series

This week many of our children will be heading back to school, and our "summer schedules" will return to more of a routine. While we won't begin our "School Year" schedule at Wesley in full swing until the week following Labor Day, I will start a new series of sermons that will take us through the rest of this year and into next year. I'm calling it "Back to Basics." I'll preach through the Gospel of Mark, which is widely considered the earliest gospel and the framework on which Matthew and Luke both based their gospels. Instead of picking the topic and searching for how the scripture speaks to it, we will just be listening through the whole gospel story and the life of Jesus for how it wants to speak to us. I would encourage you to prepare for the series by reading all of Mark's gospel in one sitting (It's only 16 chapters, about 20 pages of reading, less than a chapter in most novels). If you've never done that, you will find each gospel has its own "feel." Mark will be concise, fast-paced, and offers a powerful picture of Jesus as one with authority. While I think "less is more" in terms of reading the Bible for Spiritual formation (listening prayerfully to just a few verses or even a few words), it is a helpful exercise to hear the whole story of Jesus together. I will be preaching two or three sermons from each chapter.

Remember that tonight is this summer's final Sunday Evening at Wesley Gardens Retreat. We will have a time of Spiritual Formation with Christian Swails from 4:30 p.m.-5:30 p.m., worship from 5:30 p.m.-6:15 p.m., and dinner at 6:15 p.m. If you haven't made it out for one of these restful and spiritually rich evenings, I hope you will make it tonight.
