### **Back to (Sunday) School**

While most have already started, by the time this week is over pretty much all of our students will be back in school. College students will head off for a new year or their first year away from home. This time of year also means that summer vacations are winding down, and our schedules begin to return to the school year routine.

At the beginning of the school year, we always have a renewed emphasis on Sunday school at Wesley. Next Sunday, August 20, is "Promotion Sunday," when our children move up to their next age-appropriate class. While most adults think we are done with "school" and that Sunday school is for children and youth, at Wesley, adult Sunday school is a big part of our ministry of Christian formation, fellowship, support, and relationship building.

Next Sunday, during the Sunday school hour (9:45 a.m.-10:45 a.m.), we will have breakfast for everyone (we will start serving at 9:30 a.m.) and a gathering of all the Sunday school classes in the Fellowship Hall. During breakfast, each adult Sunday school group will share a few minutes about their class. If you are new to Wesley or have never participated in Sunday school, you will see what is available and meet people from the different classes. We will finish by 10:15 a.m. so everyone can go to their rooms.

For our children, we will also have our annual "blessing of the backpacks," so we encourage our children to bring their empty backpacks to worship for the children's sermon and a blessing on their new year.

The design for the Education Building Renovation is well underway. The building has been laser scanned, and a 3D model and drawings have been produced from the data. Teams of Architects, engineers, and specialists have completed their evaluations. The design of the new spaces is now underway, and plans are expected for their first review in a few weeks.
