Eli's Place Committee- oversees our Early Child Development Center

Missions Committee- plans our missions budget and work Youth Ministry Committee- oversees our youth ministry Senior Adults Committee- plans and works on our ministry to senior adults

Music Ministry Committee- supports Monica in our music ministry **Office Volunteers Group**- fills in for our office staff, helps with large mailings, etc.
