Pentecost

Today the church celebrates the Day/Feast of Pentecost and remembers the fulfillment of Jesus' promise to the disciples, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8. Fifty days after the resurrection and ten days after the Ascension of Jesus on the Jewish festival of Pentecost, that promise came true and those first followers of Jesus were filled with the Holy Spirit and empowered to bear witness to the hope there is in the Risen Christ. In the physical absence of Jesus with them, they now were empowered by the Spirit of the risen Christ in them. The witness they bore was in the courageous and persuasive way they witnessed in the face of opposition, in the unity they found that cut across boundaries of race, gender, age, economics, and religion, in the generosity they showed to all who had need, and in the compassion and healing they offered to all who were sick and suffering. For a brief time in history, that fledgling church bore a witness to the Kingdom of God on earth as it is in heaven. Ever since then the church has tried to live up to that example with varying degrees of success. Here at Wesley we continue in that stream of a Spirit-empowered Church and rejoice that just as daily the Lord was adding to their number, so Christ continues to lead people here and add to our number.

The last several weeks in our church have born witness to the work of the Spirit among us. Baptisms, professions of faith, confirmations, graduates, scores of children, majestic music from our choir, new members and new guests, and then an outpouring of generosity for our Capstone Capital Campaign to renovate our Education Building. How blessed we are here at Wesley. Let's not ever take this wonderful season of the Spirit for granted. We are called like those first disciples to continue to bear witness to the risen Christ in the world and at work among and within us.
