THE DISCIPLINE OF THANKSGIVING

"Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. Give thanks in all circumstances. For this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." -I Thessalonians 5:16-18

Thanksgiving may be largely an American holiday, but its roots go back much further. The people of Israel practiced "harvest" festivals to give thanks to God, and the "thanksgiving offering" was the most often practiced sacrifice. The Bible teaches consistently from start to finish that we are the beneficiaries of God's grace and that the practice of thanksgiving is critical for our relationship with God. It is so easy in times of abundance and prosperity to forget how blessed we are and where it all comes from. In the book of Deuteronomy, Moses is warning the Israelites just before they enter the promised land that the prosperity of the land could be their downfall. In times of abundance, he warns they could too quickly forget the true source of their blessings.

On the other hand, in times of adversity, it is easy to overlook our blessings because they are easily lost in the face of trouble. Not surprisingly, Paul, a man whose life had frequent adversity, taught that we should *"give thanks in all circumstances."* For Paul, thanksgiving or gratitude is a spiritual discipline to be practiced whether we are experiencing blessings or adversity.

As Thanksgiving Day approaches and we look forward to being together with family and friends, I pray we all find time to practice thanksgiving. It doesn't matter if it is a time of adversity or blessing; practicing being thankful will protect our hearts and our faith.

One historic way we practice thanksgiving is through generosity. As we bring our fall stewardship campaign to a close, we hope you will prayerfully consider how your giving can be an act of faith and gratitude for what God has done for you.
