
Pastor: Lift up your hearts.




Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine.

### The 2023 Christmas Offering - Addressing Hunger

According to Healthy Savannah, a nonprofit focused on poverty - in the fall of 2023 - 17.6% of all residents and 21.8% of children in Chatham County are food insecure. If in doubt, check out the line of cars every Friday morning at the intersection of Harmon and Anderson. As a response, our 2023 Christmas offering will be used to fund dynamic food programs that are feeding those most in need. The funds received in this Christmas offering will be divided among PACK, who feed children while out of school, Old Savannah City Mission, who feed the homeless, and Fellowship of Love, who feed families and shut-ins. Each organization provides food directly to those in need with minimal overhead and partnership with Second Harvest. If you have any questions or would like to serve more directly, contact Rev.
