It is important to remember that all are welcome at this table. It is the table of Christ, and He welcomed all, saints and sinners alike had a place. So, come once again to this training table for a life of faith, hope, and love. Here, we open our hearts to these timeless symbols that remind us the resurrected Christ is with us and in us. And as we leave, remember the world needs us.
