THE EDUCATION BUILDING RENOVATION

I am guessing that the building behind our sanctuary has been called the "Education Building" for the 100 years that it has existed. For many decades, it was primarily the home of "Sunday School." Like many church buildings, I am sure it was empty much of the week. But over the last fifteen years and the development of Eli's Place, it has been in use every day of the week. We have also seen exponential growth in our music ministry for all ages. The Chancel Choir has long outgrown the choir room. These days, more than traditional Christian Education takes place there. It seems to me it is more of a "Celebration Building" than just an education building. How blessed we are to have about 300 children in our church, 160 or so in our Children's choirs, and a Chancel Choir that now has 60 or so members.

Needless to say, what a wonderful "problem" to have. Where do we put all these people, and how do we create a space that is secure, safe, comfortable, and conducive to learning, playing, practicing, and worshiping? This is why we have launched this big renovation project and asked you to make it possible to create this space that, for decades to come, will house these important ministries.

On March 4th, The Pinyan Company will begin this extensive renovation. For the next six to eight months, we will be sharing space everywhere we can. Our Wednesday night dinner for adults will move over to Mickve Israel (we will feed the children in our buildings). Some adult Sunday school classes in Oliver Hall will triple up during the week as Eli's Place classrooms and Children's Choir classrooms (Journey and Epworth). Our Youth Ministry will be making a permanent move over to the fourth floor of Oliver Hall. Some of our Adult Sunday school classes will make temporary moves (Compass and Alpha). We are grateful for your cooperation in this extensive project. In the end, we will have a much-improved space for ministry and a building that is upto-date and safe, secure, and comfortable.

Obviously, a large project like this costs lots of money. So many of you have committed to generously supporting the work. We are asking that everyone would do something. Every gift counts as we hope to get this \$3.5 million project completed and paid for over the next three years. In addition to the renovation, we have added a renovation of the elevator to the project. As many of you have experienced since the lightning strike in July, it has become unreliable. That will add about \$250,000 to the cost of the project, but it is absolutely essential for us. Thank you for your generous support of this project and our ministry.

Today, at the "groundbreaking" lunch, we will give you more information about how the work is going to proceed and answer questions you may have.
