As you know by now, Easter came early this year. Rare is the year when we reach April, and Easter is already over. So what do we do for an encore after the days of Holy Week and the celebratory feast of Easter? To begin with, we remember that Easter is not a day but a fifty-day season. We are called to carry on the celebration of the resurrection for seven weeks leading into Pentecost. And, we have lots to celebrate here (besides the Masters, which I am always excited about.)

On April 14, our Confirmation Class will join the church. It is a very special Sunday when a group of our students, who have been meeting all year and learning about and growing in their faith, step up to this altar, profess faith in Christ, and join the church. They are here because you, as families and a church family, have sown grace and faith into their lives. Every time we baptize an infant, I remind the congregation that nothing we do is more important, and on Confirmation Sunday, we get to see the fruit of that investment into our children's lives.

That same weekend, April 12-14, Christian Swails will offer a "CoCreation" retreat at Wesley Gardens Retreat. CoCreation is the ministry of Christian and Hannah Swails. Christian, in addition to his ministry, serves on our staff as the Director of Spiritual Formation. This Retreat is a time to pull aside and, with some focused intentionality, live into the words of the Psalmist, "Be still and know that I am God." There is an opportunity to spend the weekend at the Retreat or stay in your own home at night and come out for the session on Friday night, all day Saturday, and Sunday morning. We are right at the deadline to sign up, so contact the church office for more information.

Then, Wednesday, April 17 our children will share their Easter play after dinner. They have been preparing their music and presentation throughout this winter/spring.

There are always many exciting things to celebrate here at Wesley, and even though Easter Sunday has passed, April will be full of meaningful things to celebrate.

Spiritual Direction

What is a Spiritual Direction Session Like?





It can be tough to try something new when you're not quite sure what it is or what to expect. Spiritual Direction has been historically difficult to describe because it is incredibly experiential and unique to each individual. When you book a Spiritual Direction session you will receive a text from me (Christian) to set up an initial phone call. The call is for us to "meet" one another and make sure this is a good fit for you in this season. During the call I will help you understand more about Spiritual Direction and answer any questions you may have. If we determine it's a good fit, we will meet in person at Wesley Gardens on the date you booked through the link above. We will meet in

one of the cottages or a quiet space in the main house. I will bring us into some silence together and help us settle into the space. I'll then read a piece of scripture or wisdom literature as a blessing over us. We will enter back into the silence. If you have never had the opportunity to hold sacred silence with another, it is hard to describe how transformative and revealing that space is. During those moments, the noise of life begins to fade, and what's really going on below the surface begins to emerge. So it's ok if you don't know right now what it is you want to get to in Spiritual Direction. This is what I will help you with. As the things that want to be said begin to emerge, I will invite you to share those things. I will listen, without judgement or agenda, to the places within you that have been silenced, or too busy, or too scared, or too hurt, or too confused to process. I will work with the Holy Spirit to help you discover Christ within you in those places. This is a safe, confidential, and brave space for you to notice and name the things that you can't get to on your own. I would be honored to hold this space with you.
