GENERAL CONFERENCE

When you receive this May monthly Messenger, I will be away in Charlotte, N.C., serving as a South Georgia Conference delegate to the 2024 General Conference of the United Methodist Church. This is actually the delayed 2020 General Conference that could not meet because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The General Conference is the policy-making arm of the United Methodist Church. It meets every four years and is made up of lay and clergy delegates from every Annual Conference in the world. This year, nearly 900 delegates worldwide will gather in Charlotte for ten days of worship, prayer, and holy conferencing as we define our life together as United Methodists. Being United Methodist means being connectional. It means we are better together than alone and share a common call to serve Christ in the world. We will study and vote on more than 1000 pieces of legislation. While exhausting and challenging, the Conference remains a beautiful expression of the Kingdom of God in all its diversity. Coming out of an unprecedented time of division in our denomination's history, we are focused on uniting our church and centering our attention on Christ, whose reach is wide and grace immeasurable. There is always a lot of information that comes out from news agencies, caucus groups, and individuals on social media. Sometimes, it is accurate, but just as often, it comes with an agenda that can be very misleading, intentionally divisive, and destructive. If you want to get good information about the General Conference, visit the two links below. Please pray for the General Conference and those of us who have answered a call to give leadership to our denomination as delegates. I remain very hopeful for the United Methodist Church. Our Christ-centered theology of grace and "open hearts, open minds, open hands" spirit positions us well to reach a world that is increasingly diverse and secular with the good news of Christ. When I return from the Conference, I will have a time to share with you what happened and how it affects us.



Spiritual Direction

What is a Spiritual Direction Session Like?





It can be tough to try something new when you're not quite sure what it is or what to expect. Spiritual Direction has been historically difficult to describe because it is incredibly experiential and unique to each individual. When you book a Spiritual Direction session you will receive a text from me (Christian) to set up an initial phone call. The call is for us to "meet" one another and make sure this is a good fit for you in this season. During the call I will help you understand more about Spiritual Direction and answer any questions you may have. If we determine it's a good fit, we will meet in person at Wesley Gardens on the date you booked through the link above. We will meet in one of the cottages or a quiet space in the main house. I will bring us into some silence together and help us settle into the space. I'll then read a piece of Scripture or wisdom literature as a blessing over us. We will enter back into the silence. If you have never had the opportunity to hold sacred silence with another, it is hard to describe how transformative and revealing that space is.

During those moments, the noise of life begins to fade, and what's really going on below the surface begins to emerge. So it's ok if you don't know right now what it is you want to get to in Spiritual Direction. This is what I will help you with. As the things that want to be said begin to emerge, I will invite you to share those things. I will listen, without judgement or agenda, to the places within you that have been silenced, or too busy, or too scared, or too hurt, or too confused to process. I will work with the Holy Spirit to help you discover Christ within you in those places. This is a safe, confidential, and brave space for you to notice and name the things that you can't get to on your own. I would be honored to hold this space with you.
