IT IS STILL EASTER

After pushing through the forty days of fasting and penitence for Lent, parading through the celebration of Palm Sunday, trudging through the painful days of Holy Week, and dancing through the resurrection victory of Easter, we usually want to stop and catch our breath on the other side. (Note the post-Easter falloff in worship.) This year with such an early Easter Sunday, it is easy to move on and quickly forget it is still Easter.

What is sometimes lost on us during this season is Easter, which is not just a day in the church; it is a season. The "Great Fifty Days" is how the season of Easter is described in the church year. The fifty days represent the time between the resurrection of Jesus on Easter and the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. The Scriptures tell us that for forty days after the resurrection, Jesus appeared to the disciples and other believers, and then, on the fortieth day, he "ascended into heaven."

That means for the church, the days after Easter should be one of great expectation. Like the first followers of Jesus after Easter morning, we should practice our spiritual disciplines of prayer, study, worship, and study expecting that the resurrected Christ will meet us in a renewed and meaningful way. Instead of a time to catch our breath, it should be a season that leaves us with breathless anticipation.

Christ is risen, which means Christ is with us. Like frightened disciples locked away behind doors of fear, He is with us in our fear. Like discouraged disciples wandering aimlessly down the Emmaus road, He is with us in our confusion and discouragement. Like hopeless disciples who returned to the boats and nets only to catch nothing, He is with us in our failures. Like doubting disciples who can't believe unless we see and touch, He is with us in our skepticism and doubts. Wherever the days of Easter find us, remember the message, "I am with you always even to the end of the age." Happy Easter, Christ is risen.




