
## Life at Wesley

Sometimes, I wish I could slow things down and enjoy it more, but it seems we are always planning for the next thing. In May, there are several special events we are planning to celebrate. On May 7, we will have our Children's Choir Music Awards and bring our Wednesday night program to a close until the fall (In June, we will begin our Sunday night dinner and worship program at Wesley Gardens Retreat). #### Other needs are:

- The best window for volunteer support is 4:30-6:30 p.m. (volunteers wouldn't need to stay the entire time.)
- Remainder of May: Although the kids will still be in school, they'll be past GMAS testing after early May, so there won't be as much homework. Volunteers are still welcome Tuesdays through Thursdays from 4:30-6:30 p.m. is the usual window during the school year.
- ♦ Summer (starting June 2): The club will be open from 8:00 a.m.-5:30 p.m. The ideal time for volunteer activities is generally between 10:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m.
- ♦ Types of volunteer opportunities: These include 1:1 tutoring, leading group activities in the gym or game room, reading stories to a group, or teaching a specific class. They could use up to ~20 volunteers at a time and place them throughout the club for a variety of activities.
- ♦ Age group: Volunteers would primarily work with kids ages 5-10. It's important to keep things engaging and interactive-attention spans can be short at this age!
- Cursive writing need: There's a significant need for cursive instruction, especially since it's no longer taught in schools. Even starting with helping students learn to write their names in cursive would be impactful. A volunteer could even run a class focused just on this.


