Aldersgate Day

"In the evening I went very unwillingly to a society in Aldersgate Street, where one was reading Luther's preface to the Epistle to the Romans. About a quarter before nine, while he was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation; and an assurance was given me that He had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death."

- John Wesley

On May 24, 1738, John Wesley experienced a work of God in his heart that came to be known as his "heartwarming experience." It was a life-changing moment for Wesley, who was struggling with his sense of calling and worth to God. Most historians see it as the motivating moment that would launch the Methodist movement. What Wesley experienced has often been described as one of assurance, but in essence, what Wesley experienced was grace. Grace is the unconditional love of God in Christ. We are loved not because of what we do or don't do, but because of who we are as children of God and who God is as a loving, graceful Father. Grace became the hallmark of the Methodist movement and the foundation for Methodist theology.

Wesley began to teach salvation as a process of growing in grace. It begins with what he called "prevenient grace." It means God loves us before we ever know it. It is at the heart of why we baptize infants and practice an open table at communion. Prevenient grace opened the door for the experience of "justifying grace." It is the moment when the unconditional love of God for us brings us to repentance and a commitment to a relationship with God through Christ. We are then moving into the experience of "sanctifying grace," where the unconditional love of God begins to shape our hearts like His, and we grow more and more like Jesus as grace-filled people. The end of sanctifying grace is what Wesley called "perfecting grace." It is the potential to have our hearts so filled with the love of Christ that everything we do is motivated by love. Finally, Wesley said in death we would experience "glorifying grace" through which we are fully restored in the image of God in which we were made.

On this "Methodist Heritage Day" (the Sunday closest to May 24), we celebrate grace as the hallmark of the Methodist movement. Grace is still what we hope will characterize our church. A place where people can experience the love of God through Christ embodied in the grace of his people. We open our doors, hearts, and minds to welcome all who are seeking to know and love God and neighbor. We embody grace, and grace transforms lives.
