#### WHAT'S YOUR WHY?

At the South Georgia Annual Conference meeting this year one of the exercises our program leadership introduced to us was "What's Your Why?". We were challenged to think about what is our church's why? Why do we do what we do? It means we start with our motive, our why, rather than our what or when or how. It would seem like a logical thing to do, but it is not often where we start. We ignore the motive or make some assumptions about it without ever objectively examining it.

I was thinking that question, "What's Your Why?" is really a good one for us personally. Why do I do what I do? It's worth asking about almost everything in our lives:

Why do I respond to people the way I do? Why do I prioritize what I do (how I spend my time, money, and energy)? Why do I behave the way I do?

Why do I believe what I do?

Why do I think the way I do?

Motive or our Why was always important to Jesus and one of the things he was constantly challenging people to consider. However, while I would encourage the asking of the question, I would suggest we do so prayerfully. By that, I mean asking God to search my life and reveal to me my motive. We are masters at self-deception and denial and we learn how to tell ourselves the things we think we are supposed to without being able to see ourselves clearly. The Apostle Paul memorably lamented in Romans, "I do not understand my own actions. The things I want to do I don't seem to do and the things I don't want to do I end up doing". Now Paul has what seems to him to be an easy answer; sin is the why for his baffling behavior. However, the answer to a "why" without some subsequent change, if needed, does little good. If "What's Your Why?" reveals my motive is not what it should be, it must be followed by "What am I going to do about it?" The pace of our lives often prevents us from asking "What's My Why?" So, we just keep doing what we are doing without much thought to the why until something falls apart and forces us to stop and ask. Just some food for thought.
