Adaptability

"Adaptability refers to an individual's ability to adjust and cope with changes in their environment, circumstances, or expectations. It encompasses the cognitive, emotional, and behavioral flexibility needed to navigate new situations and maintain well-being."

Adaptability is a skill we should be getting pretty good at here at Wesley. Over the last couple of years, we have been learning how to cope with change. This is particularly hard for a church with so much "tradition." I can tell you from personal experience, the older you get, the harder it is to adapt

to change. Routines become comfortable and offer a sense of security, but they also have the downside of just going through the motions of things and taking things for granted that were once meaningful and powerful.





Over the last couple of years, we have navigated changes in our denomination, the disruptions of a year without our Education Building, months without our elevator, and now months without our sanctuary. Not to mention what it all costs and how we balance mission and ministry with capital expense. We are learning to adapt. The history of God's people is one of constant change. Hebrews describes the early followers of Jesus as pilgrims seeking a homeland. Jesus trained his disciples by sending them out without the security of familiar things and places. He was teaching them to trust God, whose presence would be the one constant in an ever-changing and challenging environment. Nothing is permanent in life. Buddhism says that is the source of all suffering, trying to hold onto things that are constantly slipping through our

fingers. The writer of Revelation reminds us that God is making all things new.

Learning to adapt means learning to live with faith that creates expectation and not dread. A confidence in the grace of God to be sufficient for all circumstances. As we continue to navigate another season of disruption, may we do so with a great sense of hope and expectation of how God can redeem all the disruptions and use them to help us grow in faith, hope, and love.

• Connect Group: High School small groups that will meet before school and on Wednesday Nights! Be on the lookout for our different groups that are meeting.


• Wednesday Night: Dinner and Bible study for Middle School and Connect group for High School.


